SYLVESTER TURNER

Mayor of Houston

Elected in December 2015 and overwhelmingly re-elected in December 2019, **Houston Mayor Sylvester Turner** is serving his second four-year term. He is Houston's 62nd mayor. In his final year as Houston's top leader, Mayor Turner's theme is "execution and implementation," as he focuses on finishing major projects and initiatives.

Mayor Turner has passed seven balanced budgets within the city's fiscal constraints. He also oversaw Houston's remarkable rebound from Hurricane Harvey, championed historic pension reform, cheered on the 2017 and 2022 World Series Houston Astros, and hosted a successful Super Bowl LI. He also launched Houston's first Climate Action Plan to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, meet the Paris Agreement goal of carbon neutrality by 2050, and lead the global energy transition.

In February 2022, Mayor Turner released his One Safe Houston initiative to combat the increase in violence resulting from the pandemic. Mayor Turner's signature priorities include Complete Communities, an initiative designed to revitalize and improve Houston's most under-served neighborhoods by partnering with local stakeholders to leverage resources to create a more equitable and prosperous city for all Houstonians.



PAULA HARRIS

Executive Director, Houston Astros Foundation and Senior Vice President, Community Affairs

Paula Harris is an Astros executive with strong community ties. She currently serves on the boards of Chart Industries (GTLS), The Vantage Group, Children's Museum Houston, the Petroleum Club of Houston, the Independent Petroleum Association of America's Energy Education Center and the Energized for STEM Charter School. She is a founding member of the Young Women's College Preparatory Academy, an all-girl's engineering school serving primarily minority communities in Houston. Its goal is to send graduates to top engineering universities.

During her 33-plus years with Schlumberger Ltd., Harris began on offshore rigs as a Field Engineer and rose to leadership positions: Director of Community Affairs from 2010-2015, and, most recently as Director of Global Stewardship. A native Houstonian, Harris graduated with a B.S. in Petroleum Engineering from Texas A&M University and a Master of Education degree in Technical Instruction and Learning from Abilene Christian University.

ROSHUNDA JONES-KOUMBA

Theater director, G.W. Carver Magnet H.S. and Tony Awards winner

Roshunda Jones-Koumba received the 2022 Excellence in Theatre Education Award by The Tony Awards® organization. The award, presented by Carnegie Mellon University, recognizes a K-12 theatre educator in the U.S. who has demonstrated monumental impact on their students and embodies the profession's highest standards. A panel selected Jones-Koumba from among more than 5,000 entries.

Jones-Koumba is currently in her 18th year of education. She has dedicated all those years to Aldine ISD students, especially her theater students at Carver High School for Engineering, Applied Technology and The Arts. In 2020, Jones-Koumba was inducted into the Texas Thespians Hall of Fame and received the inaugural Arts Educator of the Year from the TUTS Leading Ladies organization. She was TxETA's 2017 Educator of the Year and Aldine ISD Carver High School's teacher of the year in 2009 and 2014.



BOOKER T. WASHINGTON H.S.

Celebrating 130 years of educational excellence

Booker T. Washington High School - popularly known as "Booker T." - is an HISD secondary school located in the Independence Heights community in Houston. The school was built in 1893, at which time it was called "Colored High."

Named after education pioneer Booker T. Washington, Booker T. Washington H. S. is home to the High School For Engineering Professions, a magnet program that has been on campus for more than 37 years.

There have been more than 20,000 graduates from this grand institution. Many of the most dynamic professional leaders of our state and the nation have roots at Booker T. Later this year, the school will mark its 130th birthday.

Fox 26 News' Jonathan Martin



Jonathan Martin is the co-anchor of FOX 26 News at 5 p.m. and 9 p.m. Since joining the FOX 26 News team in May 2016, Jonathan has covered some of Houston's biggest events. He anchored more than 20 hours of coverage as Hurricane Harvey ravaged the Texas coast. He also helped lead the station's coverage of the Astros World Series win and the funeral for former President George H.W. Bush.

Previously, Martin worked as a reporter and anchor in New Orleans, Nashville, and Augusta, Ga. He began his career as an intern and field producer at WSB-TV in Atlanta. He is a four-time Emmy nominee and has received several Associated Press honors for his work.

In 2017, Martin received a proclamation from Houston Mayor Sylvester Turner, declaring September 24th as "Jonathan Martin Day," in Houston. It was recognition for his consistent work in the community. Martin is an Atlanta native and graduate of Auburn University.

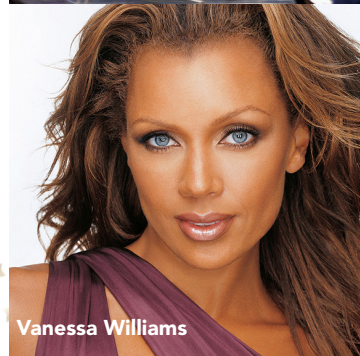
