2025 Gala: “Where Dreams Take Flight”

The Houston City College Foundation's 2025 Gala honored Texas State Rep. Christina Morales with the foundation's Crystal Eagle Award. Rep. Morales was recognized for her civic and community leadership, as well as her family's legacy of support for education, including HCC.

Held on April 26, the gala brought together more than 600 community leaders, philanthropists, educators, and distinguished guests and raised more than \$715,000 to support student success and scholarships, highlighted

with a \$20,000 Challenge Match by HCC Chancellor Margaret Ford Fisher, Ed.D., to support new baccalaureate programs in Artificial Intelligence and Robotics and Healthcare Management. The challenge raised \$40,000 for the new scholarship fund.

Other highlights included an announcement of the David & Jean Wiley Foundation's \$2 million in lifetime giving to the HCC Foundation. The David & Jean Wiley Scholarship is one of the single largest scholarships awarded by the HCC Foundation.

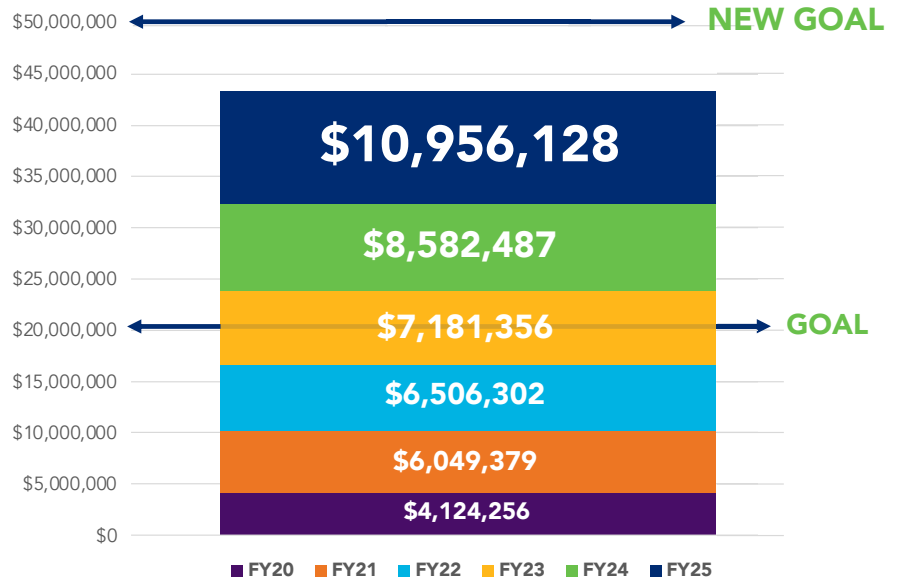

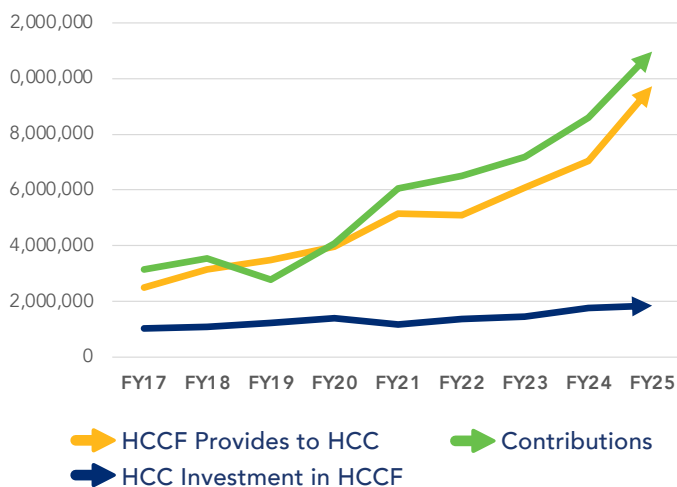

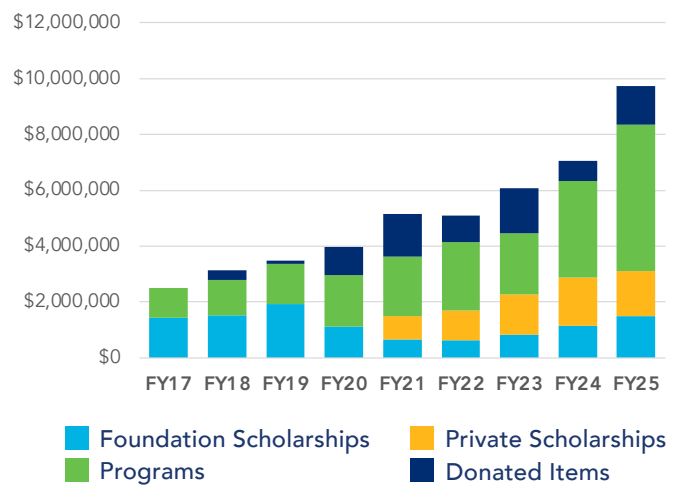


HCCF Financial Results FY17 - FY25

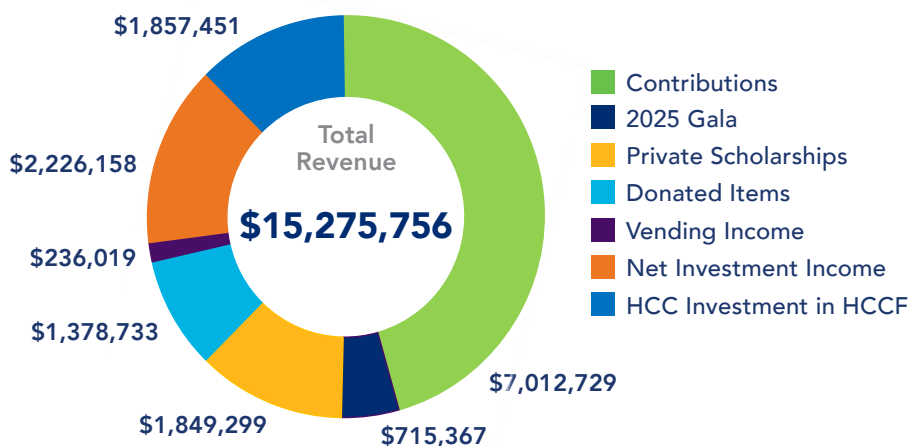
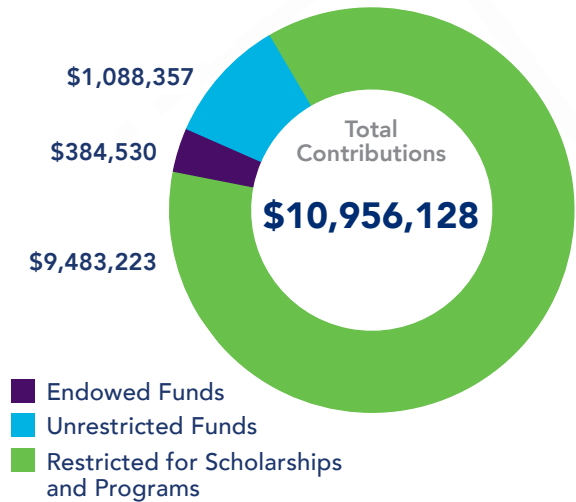
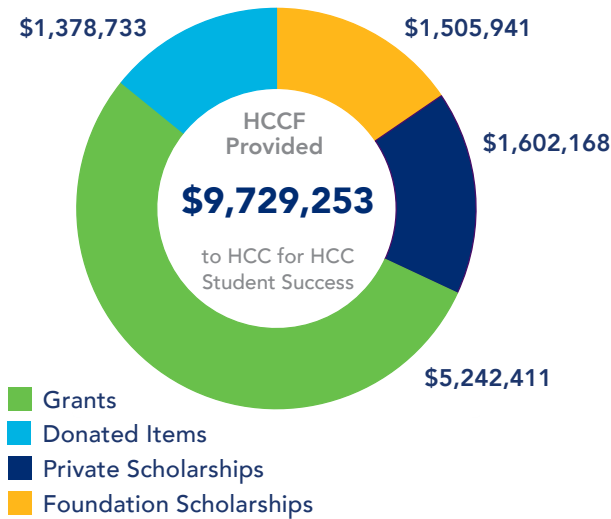


Funds Provided to HCC





FY2025 Financial Highlights | 09/01/24 - 08/31/25 (Audited)

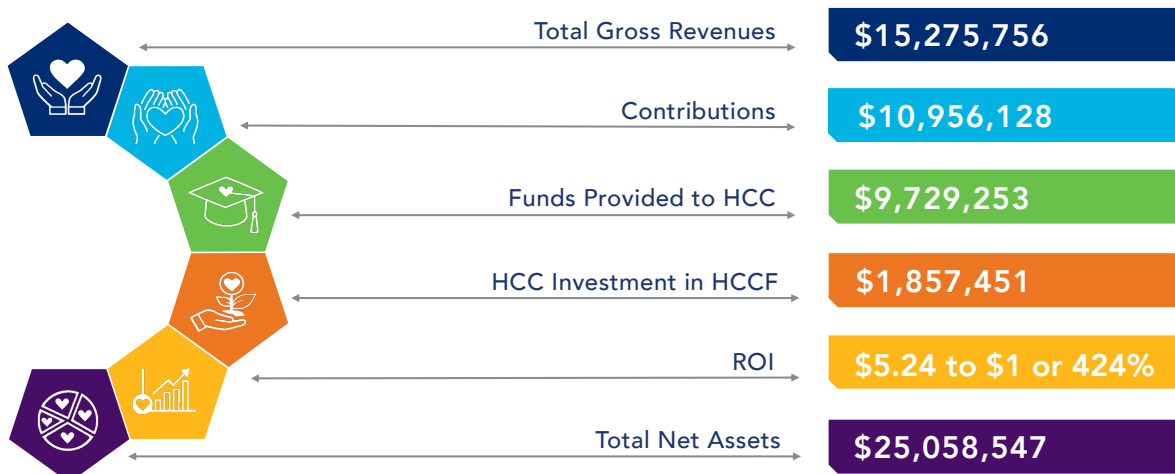
